




GOAL 1 End poverty in all its forms everywhere

GOAL 2 Zero hunger; achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

GOAL 3 Good Health and well being: ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

GOAL 4 Quality education; ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and lifelong learning for all

GOAL 5 Gender equality and empower all women and girls

GOAL 6 Clean water and sanitation; availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

GOAL 7 Affordable and clean energy; access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all

GOAL 8 Decent work and economic growth; sustained, inclusive economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all

GOAL 9 Industry, innovation and infrastructure; resilient infrastructure, inclusive and sustainable industrialization and innovation

GOAL 10 Reduced inequality within and among countries

GOAL 11 Sustainable cities and communities; make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable

"..... the goals and targets will be followed up and reviewed using a set of **global indicators** developed by the UN Statistical Department . These will be complemented by indicators at the regional and national levels which will be developed by Member States."

An **annual progress report** on the Sustainable Development Goals will be prepared by the UN, based on data produced by national statistical systems and information collected at the regional level




Goal 1. End poverty in all its forms everywhere

Target 1.4. By 2030, ensure that all men and women in particular the poor and the vulnerable, have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to basic services, ownership and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology and financial services, including microfinance

Indicator 1.4.2: Proportion of total adult population with secure tenure rights to land, with legally recognized documentation and who perceive their rights to land as secure, by sex and by type of tenure





FFP Characteristics



We deliberated (2018) and considered at the outset the key characteristics needed to concentrate on the first steps

Key characteristics (messages):

1.Purpose: Security of tenure

2.Flexible: Tenure regime in your State/Country


3.Incremental growth: Economic development & sophisticated systems

Purpose: What is Yours?




In your Country specific context

- LAS purpose usually good governance (tenure security+ value/ taxation+ planning etc)
- This needs a spatial framework (land parcel mapping) The foundation
- Established to best regulatory practice so FFP focus on:

To meet actual needs for specific functions and locations,

- What is the Tenure regime in your country?
- · Assess the demands for:
 - · accuracy,
 - interoperable spatial information
 - recording range of tenure types
- 'Have in mind' this will shape the legal and institutional framework to accommodate societal needs

Incremental



- FFP does not limit the ambitions for the ultimate solution, it is
- Designed to <u>initially</u> meet the fundamental needs of society <u>today</u>;
- But ability to be incrementally improved over time
- Have in mind: the Time and Quality and Cost triangle,
 - achieving only 2 at any given point!

Fit For Purpose - Focus



In this rapidly changing world

- Reality check (cost, time and capacity)
- Recognition of pluralisms in tenure systems
- Realigning and guiding our direction
 - FFP guide is an accelerator and enabler; but
 - Needs <u>YOU/ Land professionals</u> as a key audience (+ Strategic p'ships with others)
 - In context of public, private and civic sector
- People led process:
 - country context
 - Global to Local

A range of opportunities for *Land professionals:*

- Countrywide Land administration solution generates a larger customer base
- Need for <u>incremental</u> upgrade quality of the evidence of land rights
- Locally trained land officers requires <u>capacity building</u>, training and support services from LP's
- Role to undertake <u>managerial</u>, building and running the system and underlying land information infrastructure

The above results in increased revenue generation and improves professional status



- GGIM: platform for effective strategies on how to build and strengthen national capacity on geospatial information, and
- Includes an <u>expert group on land administration and</u> management

UN Habitat (2016) **New Urban Agenda** integrated with SDG's

- Implementation: Government addressing the SDG- i.e. leadership, governance and political will
- People led process: Local finance, local partners, local people
- Global to Local....
