KEYNOTE SPEAKER

- Surv. Vincent Olumide Adewebi Fnis Highlighted The Emerging Roles Of Geospatial Technologies, The Legalities, Rules In Surveying, Roles Of The Professional Bodies And The Imperative For Young Professionals And Students To Start Preparing For The Future.

- Qs Olusegun Ajanlekoko (casle president) duly represented by Qs (Dr.) Feyisetan Leo-Olagbaye (HOD Quantity Surveying Dept, University of Ibadan, Nigeria – spoke on sustainable development goals which the younger generation should imbibe.he challenged them to start thinking of boosting economic growth, be innovative, create sustainable cities and forge partnerships towards achieving their goals. She further encouraged youths to be tech savvy, professional, keep learning and look for good mentors.

PRE 2024 ANNUAL PROGRAMME – PROFESSIONAL ETHICS ON SURVEYING AND OTHER RELATED PROFESSIONS

- *Mrs. Rebecca A. Adetunji-Alao (MPE)* presented a paper on professional ethics on surveying and other related professions. She had a session with some students before the main programme. She spoke on the seven core principles which are: integrity, objectivity, confidentiality, professional competence, professional behavior, accountability, and professional leadership

INTERACTIVE SESSIONS -MODERATED BY SURV. MARTINS OYEKOLA

- LAW

The Dean of Faculty of Law – *Prof. Oluwayemisi Abimbola* took all attendees through some of the laws guiding professionals. She stressed that already law courses have been introduced to the school curiculum for professionals to study law as part of their course. She also guided the students on what lawyers need when handling the disputes cases among professionals.

- PROFESSIONALISM 1 - (OFFICES OF THE SURVEYOR GENERALS)

Surv. Olufemi Isaac Akintola Fnis – former surveyor general of Oyo state highlighted the important needs of the offices of the surveyor-general to regulate the surveying practices in the country, overview of the structure and operations of the Surveyor-General office in Oyo state, duties and responsibilities and the achievements as the fore-runner in Geospatial information management. He also explained the legal framework governing land survey in Nigeria and finally gave recommendations for advancing to the next level in Geospatial next and conditions for future surveyors to practice when they become registered surveyors with the surveyor's council of Nigeria.

- PROFESSIONALISM 2 - (NIGERIAN INSTITUTION OF SURVEYORS - NIS)

Surv.(*Prof*) *Raphel Oyinloye Fnis* (dept of surveying and geoinformatics, lead city university, ibadan, oyo state nigeria) spoke briefly on the history of the nigerian institution of surveyors before putting the attendees on the part way to becoming members of the nigerian institution of surveyors through student, probationer, associates, full membership and fellow cadres. The qualifications of each cadres, annual dues and registrations with relevant bodies to enable them move forward. He stressed the importance of their contributions to the growth of the institution.

- PROFESSIONALISM - 3. (ASSOCIATION OF PRIVATE PRACTISING SURVEYORS - APPSN)

Surv. Adams Olugbenga (the APPSN National PRO) also spoke briefly on the history of the Nigerian institution of surveyors before the history, objectives, functions and focus of APPSN. He talked about quackery and those shortchanging themselves in collecting peanuts. This will enable young surveyors know that self development and ethical practices are what will make them future leaders. He also itemized 11 points of the role of APPSN to practicing surveyors and its evolvement.

- YOUNG SURVEYOR NETWORK YSN (FIG AND NIGERIA) -

Surv. Elegbede David (FIG Young Surveyor Network Africa Chair) – Surv. David reiterated that the programme is all about them and they should take notes of all that was taught. He reintroduced the YSN to the attendees especially the students that they are part of the group and its all about preparing them for the future. He further enlightened them of various opportunities to build capacity, polish their potentials and advance in geospatial technology through workshops and seminars as well as fig working weeks and conferences. He spoke briefly on the history of the fig to the creation of young surveyor networks, their programmes in Nigeria, Africa and worldwide.
