
Origins and Characteristics

- support and data from PCGIAP and FIG-Commission 7 delegates
- regular updates mainly from FIG-Commission 7 delegates
- content:
 - Descriptive Country Report (country context, institutional framework, description of cadastral system, cadastral mapping, reform issues)
 - Basic Indicators
- new web design in 2012, with existing data structure
- on-going support, input, and updates from FIG-Commission 7







Issues



- web design, technology, and user interface need an upgrade
- in order to remain relevant, the CT needs to accommodate key indicators for SDGs

Role of Cadastral Template over the next 4-year-term (Daniel Páez)

- 1. More figures needed: how many countries, how many visits per months, etc. Do you have some of this data?
- 2. <u>General strategies for the future of the Cadastral Template</u>:
 - a. should cadastral template be more a tracking tool in where countries report how they are travelling in land issues to meet their SDGs?
 - b. Are we going to keep populating it using FIG delegates or use other bodies such as UNGGIM, draw information from other sources (such as the world bank doing a business evaluation of property registration), or a combination of all these methods?
- 3. Timeframe is ambitious and too optimistic
- 4. Commission 7 should produce a short document about SDGs and land to coincide with the new version of the Cadastral Template. Ideally, every year we will produce a short document that summarises SDGs progress in the land administration and management field.
