


The individual Surveyors spread over now 36 member states are the final and most important beneficiaries of our activities.

- Education
 - 5 years University or Technical High School
 - Bachelor in Geodetic Surveying
 - Master in Geodetic Surveying
 - Main Courses
 - Geodesy, Mapping, GIS, Cadastre, Real Estate Regulations, Land Use and Planning, Ownership and Property Law

Content of the Code

- Professional experience
 - 2 3 years of traineeship
 - Mentor
 - In the Administration
- Verification of knowledge
 - Harmonization
 - State examination



Content of the Code

- Public appointment
 - Generally confirmed by an oath
- Code of Conduct
 - Cfr. CLGE, national codes
- Disciplinary body
 - Independence
- Quality control
 - Idem
