


## SMART SURY CHALLENGES

### What is EALAN?

The Eastern African Land Administration Network (EALAN) is a platform for academic and knowledge exchange constituting of mainly academic institutions in the **Eastern Africa region**.

The network has had major strides in various aspects such as developing or reviewing and harmonizing land administration related curricula in the Eastern Africa region, executing collaborative researches across the region and providing short courses for land professionals.



















## Successes of the EALAN Network

EALAN's contribution to the SDG 4 (Quality Education)

- How EALAN addresses inequalities by promoting gender inclusion
  - Provision of scholarships to girls
  - Advertisements and encouraging girls to participate in surveying and land administration courses
  - Many universities have open days, students are informed of their career opportunities upon completion of education
- How EALAN is delivering well trained/prepared graduates
  - By involving students to real-life problems and solutions, for example the LAND Clinic in INES-ruhengeri
- How EALAN addresses inequalities in graduation/dropouts: is education only for those who can afford to pay the fees?
  - Addressing the issue of dropouts due to funding challenges;
     or due to other challenges















## EALAN & COVID-19: Challenges & Coping Strategies

Network Cohession	
1 2020 AGM cancelled – interfered with network cohesion	<ul> <li>Virtual meetings for urgent issues</li> </ul>
2. Donors diverted AGM funding - Network has no budget	<ul> <li>Members contributing annual fees for Network activities</li> </ul>
3. Coordination/logistical challenges	<ul> <li>Few activities are done online while others are postponned</li> </ul>
Education	
1. Online education	<ul> <li>Internet stability, or lack of internet due to costs or network issues, and</li> </ul>
	limited or lack of internet gadgets to students etc
2. Digital/internet literacy	<ul> <li>Training teachers and students on skills to use internet for teaching and</li> </ul>
	learning
3. Graduation of students in 2020	<ul> <li>Physical/on site and virtual graduation were used</li> </ul>
Research cross the region	
1. Lockdown halted data collection & research	<ul> <li>This was postponed, since travel restrictions are still there within member</li> </ul>
	states
	<ul> <li>Target respondents (land owners in rural areas) unreachable (phone number</li> </ul>
	missing, no travels to fieldwork).
Short courses for land professionals & community	
Outreach	
1. Short courses for land professionals cancelled	Both short courses all cancelled
2. Land clinic stopped	Land clinic can only work live





## Implications of Covid-19 and EALAN's link with SDG4

- 1: Network & Secretariat
- 2: Short Courses
- 3: Education
- 4: Research

- COVID-19 has mainly negative influence on higher education and subsequently to contribution to SDG 4
- Despite challenges, some universities in the EALAN Network have restarted teaching and learning through various platforms as coping strategies
- Extent to which EALAN Network universities' coping strategies can enable achieving SDG4 under covid restrictions is unknown.
