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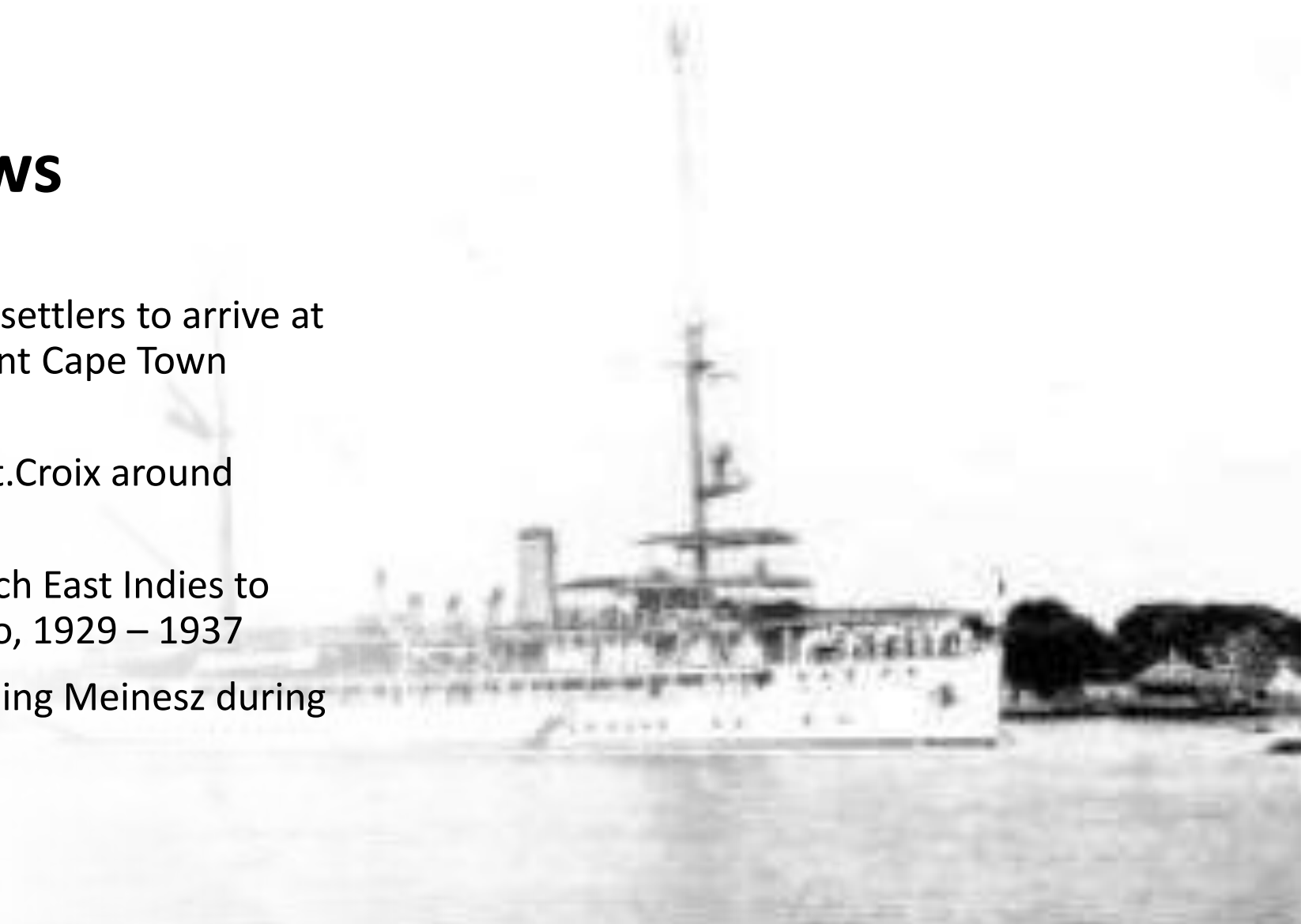

- D. The boat used by professor Vening Meinesz during his scientific expeditions.





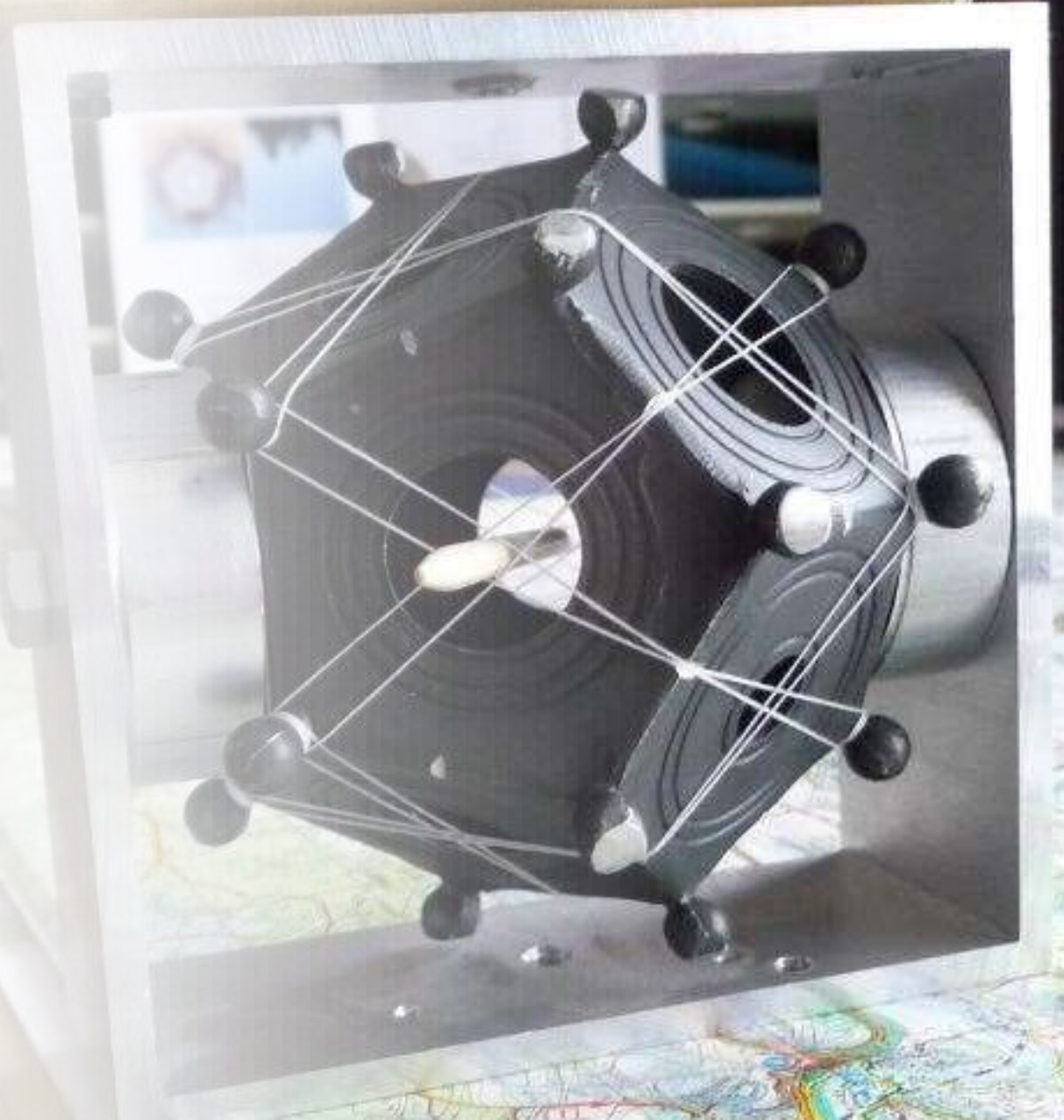
